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2022 Contributions and Charges Note Sheet Kindergarten to Year 6

Note 1. Classroom Incursions/Excursions	Based on previous years activities and expenses the school has estimated the annual charge for incursions and excursions for your child for their grade. The amount is set out in the table.
Note 2. Beach Swimming	Years 5 and 6 attend lessons at Cottesloe beach each morning for 2 weeks in Term 1.
Note 3. Applications for iPads	Applications for iPads required for school, charged at cost price, these include Book Creator, Padlet, Popplet, Pic Collage and STEM apps
Note 4. Digital Licenses	Software licences for students for digital programs such as Mathletics, Lexile Reading, charged at cost
Note 5. Interschool	Transportation costs for swimming, athletics, cross country, and lightning interschool carnivals
Note 6. Sailing	Sailing - Year 6 students attend weekly sailing lessons during term four at Royal Freshwater Bay Yacht Club. The charge includes bus transport and sailing instruction.
Note 7. Specialist Dance	Cost per student for term 4 dance program run by external providers
Note 8. Swimming/Pool	Annual charge for the use of the school pool for swimming lessons, sport, carnivals
Note 9. UNSW	This cost is for Yr 3/4 students Science test and Yr 5/6 Science/English and Maths tests run by the University of New South Wales
Note 10. Young Leaders	Young Leaders Conference - this includes admission fee and bus transport to Young Leaders conference presented by Halogen in term 1 at the Perth Convention and Exhibition Centre
Note 11. iPad Lease	Existing Yr 3 students and new year 3-6 students arriving through the year - the charge is for the lease of an iPad for their use at the school from a third party provider at cost.
Note 12. Curriculum	This is an optional charge. A yearly contribution to the school to assist with curriculum initiatives. Each year, the school seeks to initiate improvements to the curriculum for the benefits of all students.
Note 13. P&C	This is an optional charge. The P&C arranges activities throughout the year. This fee provides it with an initial budget for this. It's other funds are raised by independent fund raising by the P&C.

Note 14. Building Fund	This is an optional charge. The school is seeking a donation of between \$125.00 (as a minimum - this is the figure that appears in the table at present) or, from those willing and able, \$500.00 per student (if you wish to donate this amount, please click on the "Amount" column. The school Building Fund is established to undertake projects for the improvement of the school and its facilities. In 2022, the Building Fund is seeking to raise a total of \$60,000 in order to pay for shading and seating for the school swimming pool and 6 native garden beds for the school grounds, with any surplus funds to go towards the design of new showers and changerooms for the students, primarily for them to use after swimming pool activities. Note 15. Year 6 Camp	Year 6 students attend a week-long camp to Mandajel in term 3. The charge includes bus transport, accommodation, meals and activities. The Leeuwin experience includes overnight accommodation, meals, and an evening and whole day sailing experience.
Note 16. Year 5 Camp	This fee includes, transport, accommodation, some activities and some meals for the annual 4-day camp to Rottnest held in Term 3/4.
Note 17. Choir	If your child chooses to participate in senior choir Yr3-6 or Junior choir Yr 1-2, this fee is payable.
Note 18. IMIS	This fee is only payable if your child will in 2022 be participating in Instrumental Music in Schools
Note 19. IMIS	This fee is only payable if your child will be hiring an instrument in 2022 for Instrumental Music in Schools
Note 20. Orchestra	School orchestra. This fee is only payable if your child is in the orchestra in 2022.
Note 21. PEAC	Selected students can choose from a range of ~45 courses of varying costs; Round 1 for Year 5 PEAC students is an Introduction to PEAC course and costs \$30. PEAC Induction day for Year 4 students \$45 payment due with Round 1 Year 5 payment. Year 5: \$95 - \$275 per Year. Year 6: 3 Rounds of PEAC courses \$30 - \$300 per year. Costs will be billed prior to the start of each round. Year 5 students selected to attend PEAC will be charged according to the courses they choose to enrol in. Total cost will not exceed \$275. Year 6 students selected to attend PEAC will be charged according to the courses they choose to enrol in. Total cost will not exceed \$300
Note 22. Stationery	Student stationery: is purchased by parents directly from Dalkeith Newsagency or other preferred supplier prior to Term 1, 2022. Stationery lists have been already sent out and are available on the school website
Note 23. Uniforms	School uniforms: may be purchased new or second hand from the Uniform Shop, run by the School P&C. Prices vary depending on item and quantity
Note 24. Photos	School photos: these costs are optional and are advised by the photographer company at the time of photos
